## “Unprecedented”

Believe it or not, there was no course at the Seminary for “how to do church during a pandemic.” There is, however, the strong Word of God on which to rely. Time and again over the past month, I have seen the Word of God calm troubled hearts, re-order priorities, and broadcast the good news of Jesus’ action to new audiences. There really is no stopping God’s powerful Word.

“For as the rain and snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but **it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.**” (Isaiah 55; 10—11, ESV)

We have not been able to meet as we would like, and it has not been easy for our fellowship to be scattered. But make no mistake; the Word of God is not dormant. It is on the move, accomplishing God’s purpose in pointing people to Jesus. And when the day comes that we can finally gather together around His gifts again, it will be His Word that is at the center of our activity. It is the Word of sin and grace; Law and Gospel; repentance leading to the forgiveness of sins; the story of a boundless and unprecedented love made known in Jesus’ life, death, resurrection, ascension, and eventual return. This is our confidence.



We have started a new streaming series on Facebook Live called “@ the Cross” where we discuss all things Christian. We don’t use fancy church words or dig deep into any one topic, but our aim is to explore God from various perspectives: through various lenses and contexts. And our hope, our goal is to help guide you into a deeper, more personal relationship with Him through these conversations.

This series was created specifically for everyone. It is a place where, together, we can explore these big questions, beliefs, and views. Who is God? Who is Jesus? What is the Bible, really? And how does all of this actually affect me and how I view, and how I live my life? This is a place where no question is too simple, too obvious, or not worth asking. It’s also a place where your beliefs or presuppositions may be challenged. That’s good because that’s how we will grow - together.



## Stewardship in the COVID-19 Era

The Board of Stewardship has been active during these weeks of the pandemic, as we continue efforts to use our gifts of time, talent and treasures to bring glory to God. This month, we would like to share personal reflections from two special people, Pastor Matzke and Amanda Hedrick, Financial Secretary about the impact of COVID 19 on their roles & ministries. A brief summation of church finances will follow.

**From Pastor Mark:** COVID-19 has changed many things about everyday life, but it has not changed my calling as a pastor. According to Scripture and our Lutheran Confessions, pastors are called to preach and teach the Word of God and administer the sacraments. My main concern during this time of pandemic has been living out my calling in a situation where we cannot physically gather. The approach I have taken is to rely on technology to reach people with the Word, and personal, individual ministry to administer the gift of the Lord's Supper. How does this relate to stewardship? It's simple: Our understanding of stewardship is that it is a whole-life response to the Good News. From a pastoral standpoint, I am called to preach and teach God's Word so that God's people have Good News to which to respond. ("How can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" (Romans 10: 14b-c)) My personal stewardship of time has been pointed at making sure people continue to meet Jesus in His Word and at His Table, which fosters a response of faith and service in them.

**From Amanda:** As the St. Mark financial secretary, I record all the incoming contributions from our members and guests and provide statements twice a year that reflect individual contributions. One thing I have learned over the past few years is that St. Mark members are faithful to their church family and very responsive to our financial responsibilities. Over the last month, it has been so encouraging seeing envelopes come in for weeks in advance and checks being written to cover multiple weeks of offerings, knowing that our members aren't sure when we will meet again in person. I have noted 23 new accounts in our online giving platform since the suspension of in-church services! This is great news not only for sustained giving now, but in the future as well when families are on vacation or snowbirding or just happen to miss a week or two of

Sunday services. This month's online contributions to date: \$10,088. Contributions from 4/5-4/11 that came into the church office: \$9668

**Additional Information re: Stewardship:** Erna Mabel, Treasurer, reports that at the end of the first quarter, we were approximately \$15,000.00 donations ahead of expenditures. Council and leaders will carefully review any discretionary spending. Sue Brill submitted the church's application for funds under the federal Payroll Protection Program. Unfortunately, the program is out of funds currently, but the bank has the paperwork to proceed if more monies become available. We have been in contact with Lisa Janik, Lutheran Church Extension Fund, should the congregation need to explore loan re-amortization or to establish a line of credit. **A huge thank you** to every member for your financial generosity during this unprecedented time in our church history. Because of you, St Mark's mission, vision, and supporting ministries continue to proclaim the Gospel near and far. And please, contact the church if there is any way you need help (church office, Pastor, Elder, Caring & Sharing). We are family and we are in this together.
