

The Best Medicine

Near the end of his life, Protestant reformer Martin Luther suffered debilitating headaches. When told about a costly medicine that might offer some relief, Luther smiled and said, "My best prescription for head and heart is that 'God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

That Bible verse became a refrain for Luther on his deathbed. "What Spartan saying can be compared with this wonderful brevity," he said of John 3:16. "It is the Bible itself!" After repeating the words of that Gospel-in-a-nutshell verse three times in Latin, Luther exclaimed, "They are the best prescription for headaches and heartaches!"

Operation Christmas Child Sowing Seeds of Love and Hope

I just had a remarkable conversation with Alex Nsengimana, a young man of Rwandan descent whose life was changed by an Operation Christmas Child box back in the mid-1990's. (Fortunately, it was recorded and will be made available for anyone who would like to watch and listen.) What made it 'remarkable' was the clear sense of calling with which Alex shares his story and the sheer power of the Gospel to change human hearts. I am hesitant to share too many specifics about the content of the conversation, because it would be much better if you heard it from him, so consider this an encouragement to seek it out on our Facebook page or our church website and to take the time to actively listen.

I will share this: If you are on the fence about packing a box, consider that you might be "planting seeds of love and hope" in a child's heart (to borrow Alex's memorable phrase). This is not just a feel-good giveaway of disposable items. Operation Christmas Child is intentional about leading the children who receive boxes to hear the good news of Jesus. It is an excellent example of the 'show and tell' method of outreach that makes a real difference in the world.

Talking with Alex, I was struck (yet again) by the beauty and strength of the Word of God. Ultimately, that is what entered Alex's life, helping him to address some exceptionally heavy questions and find healing in Jesus. I cannot overemphasize the importance of allowing God to regularly speak to you through His Word, whether in worship, personal devotions, Bible Study, Scripture-based music—in whatever mode suits you best. In Hebrews 1:3, we are told that Jesus is "sustaining all things by his powerful word," and the word for "powerful" in this verse is the same word from which we get the word "dynamite" or "dynamic." The Word of our Lord is explosive, and it changes things, especially the contour of human hearts. I am very grateful I had the opportunity to hear how this was true in the case of Alex Nsengimana, and I hope it will bless you, as well.
